I hope this letter finds you well, and we appreciate your continued support of your child's education within our diocesan system of schools. I am writing to provide you with an important update regarding the school calendar and your school's pupil-free day schedule.

As you may be aware, the New South Wales curriculum has recently undergone a major reform aimed at enhancing the learning experience for students. This reform entails significant pedagogical shifts and updates to content knowledge, ensuring a comprehensive and relevant education for your child. To ensure our teachers are equipped with the necessary skills and knowledge to deliver high-quality education, sectors and schools across the state are prioritising additional professional learning time (pupil-free days).

In alignment with our commitment to providing the best possible education for your child, we have allocated an additional two pupil-free days for each school in our system. These days, which will be taken in the second semester of the school year, offer valuable opportunities for our teachers to engage in deep learning, collaborate with colleagues, and enhance their instructional practices.

One of the additional pupil-free days will be held on 15 September, during which a system-wide curriculum reform symposium will take place. This symposium is a collaborative effort co-hosted by our school system and Catholic Schools New South Wales (CSNSW). It will bring together staff from all schools within our diocese and additional teachers from across the state to engage in deep professional learning. This collective learning experience will further enhance our teachers' skills and promote consistency in delivering the new curriculum.

We understand that the addition of professional learning days may require adjustments to your family's schedule. Your school will provide you with well-advanced notice of the relevant dates on which your child will not attend school due to pupil-free days. We greatly appreciate your understanding and support in allowing our teachers to engage in this essential learning opportunity.

The commitment to additional professional learning across all sectors and schools in NSW reflects our shared goal of continuous improvement and delivering the best possible educational outcomes for your child. We are confident that the investment in our staff's professional growth will yield long-term benefits and contribute to the continued success of our students.

# KEEPING CHILDREN SAFE IN AND OUT OF THE CAR For Parents

Children aged between four and seven years cannot travel in the front seat of a vehicle with two or more rows, unless all other back seats are occupied by children younger than seven years in a child car seat.

# NATIONAL CHILD RESTRAINT LAWS REQUIRE YOUR CHILD TO BE RESTRAINED IN THE CAR AS FOLLOWS:

- 0 6 months Approved rear-facing child car seat.
- 6 months 4 years Approved rear or forward-facing child car seat.
- 4+ years Approved forward-facing child car seat or booster seat.
- 145cm or taller Suggested minimum height to use adult lap-sash belt.

### HERE ARE A FEW THINGS YOU CAN DO TO HELP KEEP YOUR CHILDREN SAFE IN AND OUT OF THE CAR:

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A child who is

properly secured in

an approved child

car seat is less likely

to be killed or

injured in a crash

than one who is not.

- Children should remain in the car until an adult opens the 'Safety Door'. This is the rear footpath side door of the car.
- A sleeping child must remain firmly buckled up while in the car.
- Assist your children to buckle up always check the seatbelt is buckled up firmly and not twisted.
- Make it a rule that every passenger must be securely buckled into a seatbelt or child car seat before you start the car.
- Always help your child get in and out of the car through the 'Safety Door'.

Never leave a child of any age in a vehicle without adult supervision. Children may rapidly suffer from dehydration, heat exhaustion and organ failure if left unattended, especially on hot days.
