Holy Week

Congratulations to the 14 children who received the Sacrament Of Confirmation last Friday. They were very reverent throughout the Mass, making a personal commitment to grow in the knowledge, love, and practice of their Catholic faith. Thank you to Bishop Columba and Fr Barry for celebrating the Mass.



Palm Sunday, celebrated on the 24th of March this year, leads us into Holy Week. Holy Week is the most sacred time of the year for Christians. The Sacred Triduum falls within this week. The three days of the Triduum are counted from dusk to dusk, as the Hebrews counted their days. The evening Mass on Holy Thursday begins the Sacred Triduum, followed by Good Friday and the Easter Vigil. Easter Sunday celebrates Christ's resurrection.

Holy Thursday: Commemorates the Last Supper and the institution of the Eucharist **Good Friday:** A day of fasting and penance, remembering Jesus' crucifixion and death

Easter Vigil: The first official celebration of the Resurrection of Jesus, on the Saturday before Easter Sunday, reminds Christians that Jesus is the light of the world who has conquered darkness and death. It marks the last day of Lent and Holy Week. Easter Sunday: Celebrates the Resurrection of Jesus Christ on the third day after his Crucifixion.
